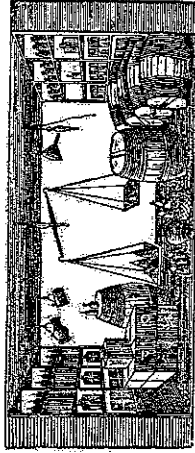

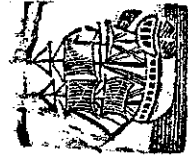
On Sunday the 18th of September absconded from his service at Franklin Park, Near Burlington,
